



## **New Home Construction and Emergency Repairs Guidelines**

Due to COVID-19, Hiawatha First Nation has put limitations and guidelines in place for all new home construction and emergency repairs;

1. Construction work is limited to new homes and emergency repairs;
2. New construction- is considered a home that is not currently occupied. Emergency repairs- is considered work that needs to be done to maintain health and safety in your home (roof repairs, plumbing, etc);
3. All work requires a permit to be issued by Trisha Shearer, First Nation Administrator (FNA). Without a permit, workers will not be given access at the checkpoint;
4. Work must follow gathering guidelines and not exceed 5 people;
5. Only 1 trade is allowed to be on-site at one time (plumber, carpenter, etc). You must notify the FNA when the trades people will be coming to the community, so that their names can be added to the checkpoint list (2 days notice is preferred).

Failure to comply with these guidelines could result in fines issued under the State of Emergency order.
