The purpose of the Indigenous Student Advisor position is to identify and support the social, emotional, intellectual, cultural and physical well-being of indigenous students. The Indigenous Student Advisor acts as a resource and provides broad expertise and opportunities to indigenous students.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Consult with Principals, consultants, and teachers on issues affecting the social, emotional, intellectual, cultural and physical well-being of First Nations, Métis and Inuit students;
- Collaborate with the Indigenous Education Liaison in planning and delivering cultural awareness presentations to grades JK through to high school;
- Support student achievement for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students, by supporting cultural initiatives in schools:

- Liaison with community service providers and external agencies as Board representative through committee membership to advocate for First Nations, Métis and Inuit student needs;
- Support Principals, consultants and teachers when meeting with First Nations, Métis and Inuit students and their families to determine students' IEP goals and behaviour plans through a culturally relevant lens, if required;
- Supports school staff in the culturally relevant and effective management of student behaviour by promoting the development of appropriate social, communication and behavioural skills and expectations for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students;
- Provide for and advise on First Nations, Métis and Inuit resources for use within the Board, in collaboration with the Indigenous Education Liaison;
- Maintains accurate documents and provides statistical reports as required;
- Other duties as assigned by the Superintendent of Education: First Nation, Métis and Inuit, Education Equity, Diversity and Inclusive Education.

EDUCATION & EXPEREINCE REQUIRED:

- Bachelor's degree in indigenous education or Bachelors of Social work with specialization in Indigenous studies;
- Native Counsellor Training Certificate Program offered through the Native Education Counsellors Association;
- Knowledge of computer applications.
- Knowledge and understanding of First Nation, Métis and Inuit history, culture and traditional practices;
- Knowledge of current political, cultural, and social awareness of issues impacting First Nation, Métis and Inuit youth
- Knowledge of community and social service agencies that serve First nation, Métis and Inuit families
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills
- Excellent organizational skills
- Proven experience with behaviour management techniques and strategies, and the implementation of behaviour plans
- Excellent problem solving skills
- Knowledge of a variety of computer applications, including Virtual Video Conferencing.

WORKING CONDITIONS:
