


How to use the First Nation reserve drop-down menu

Elections Ontario has been working hard since the 2018 election to remove barriers to voting for Indigenous communities. Updates to our online voter registration process, eRegistration, enables those who may have atypical addresses to use the online tool. eRegistration now has a drop-down menu of First Nation reserves that can be selected in lieu of a civic address.

Confirming, updating or adding your information to the voters list through eRegistration enables Elections Ontario to send you a voter information card (VIC) during the election, with information about when and where to vote. Follow the steps below to confirm, update or add your information.




Visit eregistration.elections.on.ca to get started.






Check if you are already registered to vote.

Option 1: Attempt to find yourself using a civic address.





When this screen appears, enter in your personal information, and select your First Nation reserve from the drop-down menu.



If you cannot find yourself, move through the rest of the eRegistration process to add yourself to the voters list.

Please note, you can upload the band Letter of Confirmation of Residency as your ID for eRegistration.



Option 2: Attempt to find yourself using the 'First Nation reserve drop-down' feature.

First, select 'I live on a First Nation reserve.'
