Day Clinic (Peterborough Clinic)

A physician clinic which provides medical services to the community through pre-booked appointments. Call or go to the clinic to make a same-day appointment.

VON 360 Degree Nurse Practitioner-Led Clinic

A nurse practitioner-led clinic, located in downtown Peterborough. Provides medical and supporting services to registered patients. Has a special focus on clients who may have difficulty accessing primary health care.

The only emergency care facility in Peterborough. Provides unscheduled urgent and non-urgent patient care to adults and children.

DENTAL SERVICES

Dental programs include:

- dental screening in elementary schools;
- basic dental care for children and youth, aged 17 and under, whose adjusted family is \$20,000 or less;
- financial assistance for children with urgent dental needs;
- limited financial assistance for adults in need of emergency dental treatment; and
- Community Dental Health Centres.

Some programs provide dental services at no cost to families based on age, need, and income level. Call to see if you are eligible. All of our programs allow you to choose who to visit for dental care.

FOOT CARE CLINICS

Basic foot care provided by trained volunteers to registered clients of Community Care. People 60 years or older, or adults with a physical challenge can register as clients. Fees are \$15 per visit. Appointment required. Not offered in July and August.

VON - Victorian Order of Nurses

Foot care provided at clinics and as an in-home service. In clinics, fees are \$45 for the first visit and \$32 after that. In-home services are \$60 for the first visit and \$50 after that

GENETIC COUNSELLING

Genetic counselling to help individuals and families understand the nature, inheritance and implications of genetic conditions and make informed decisions. Provides clinical services covered by the Ontario Ministry of Health in the area of prenatal/preconception, adult, pediatric and cancer genetics.

Immunizations and TB skin testing for Peterborough County and City residents who do not have a family doctor or nurse practitioner. Charges for vaccines may apply in some cases.

Provides consultation and travel immunizations. Charges apply for vaccinations. Book at least 2 months before travelling.

IN-HOME HEALTH & SUPPORT SERVICES

Services include: case management, visiting nursing, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, nutrition, speech therapy, social work, placement coordination, homemaking and personal care, caregiver relief and laboratory services.

Provides midwifery services throughout healthy pregnancy, labour, and delivery, and continued care for 6 weeks after birth. Services are covered by OHIP. No referral required.

Free breast cancer screening, including mammograms, for women who are 50 years or over.

Offers information, counselling and/or treatment in the following areas: recent sexual assault, childhood sexual abuse, domestic violence, eating disorders, unplanned pregnancy, hassle-free pregnancy testing, menopause and post-natal mood disorders.

A lending library provides women with reliable health information in the form of books, pamphlets and videos.

Specific programs include:

Unplanned Pregnancy Program

Includes pregnancy testing, counselling to help women look at all their choices, referral to supportive community services for women who decide to continue their pregnancy, therapeutic abortion services and referral, counselling and follow-up services.

Sexual Assault/Domestic Violence Response Program

Specially trained Nurses on call 24/7 to respond to individuals who have experienced recent sexual assault or domestic violence and require medical attention. Counselling sessions are also available.
